State Finals Report

Let me start off by asking everyone in the Organization to say a prayer for David, Robin and Marci. I can imagine that they could use all they can get right now. We are all with you guys.

Well, it seems like just yesterday we had our 1st banquet as PSHA, and now here we are at State Finals number two.

We have had a great weather year so far and I'm hearing there are a lot of rides happening, but sponsorships are still way down. I would ask that all active clubs and contact Shannon and try and fill in the gaps. As of my last update from Shannon we still only have 3 saddles sponsored....That leave 5 more. Any help would sure be appreciated.

This years State Finals committee, has a few changes. Dawn Reimann will coordinate Grand Entry, Kelsey Morgan will be in charge of Secret Pals, and we

are still looking for help in the announcers booth....I don't want to burn out the dynamic duo, so, volunteers?

Other than that, most positions are the same with the exception of the Rules committee. Several of the folks on the committee will be coming into Appleatchee on Wednesday, or early Thursday to make preparations, so I ask that you not show up early this year....If you do, you will be held in the upper day parking area until 1pm.

Here are a list of other changes:

- *If temperatures reach the 100's again, we may take a break during the heat of the day. We still prefer not to do this, but we want to have the option just in case it's 113 degrees again.*
- *Camping will not open until 1PM on Thursday the 13th. The only way you will be allowed in early is if you are on the State Finals Committee list....This will include folks that are responsible for some aspect of the State Finals Show. Also, Appleatchee Members....They have open access to camping on the property. If you arrive early, you will be held in the upper day parking area until 1PM, no exceptions.*
- *Camping spots and fire lanes will be marked. There will be 4 campsites per water and electrical connection box, and you will have to pay for what you use...Each spot that is used will have to have a 'Pass' displayed. If you use two spots you will be charged for two spots and given two passes to display. There will be open tent camping up against the East fence of the camping area. It is intended as overflow and no vehicles will be allowed in the tent area. Also, no parking in marked fire lanes.*
- *Since we had complaints last year about noise late, we will be enforcing quite time starting at 11PM. This is a big issue at the North end and middle of the campground since folks live directly adjacent to those areas....If you anticipate having noisy gatherings, you may want to make camp at the South end of the campground. We will start quite time enforcement at the North end first, and the South end last...If you are making a bunch of noise, you can anticipate being asked to quite down after 11PM.*

Ok, two weekends left to get those last couple of times you need....Ride fast, and safe. See you in about 4 weeks.

Treasurer report for State & Interstate

I will start out with the PSHA financial status. As of June 30th, we had \$14,032.51 in the bank. Net Profit for the 2008-2009 season through June 30th, 2009 was \$10,212.41. That includes the convention expenses from last year and a few expenses that straggled in from last season. I will be glad to e-mail you a copy of the Profit and Loss Statement and the Balance Sheet if you are really interested.

To date we have collected \$5,630.00 in sponsorships and advertising for State Finals. Of this, all but \$700.00 came from Kirk Weinz, Lesa Bland, and the Short Family. Not sure how good your match skills are, so I will figure it out for you. 88% of the funding for your awards has come from the efforts of these people. Kudos to them and I will let you fill in the blanks for everyone else. The other 12% knows who they are and many thanks to them. Do you realize that we have 163 families and 210 individual memberships? That means .01% of our members are bringing in the dollars. 'Nuff said.

We had our Interstate meeting yesterday. Looks like everything is progressing well. Hopefully some of the inconveniences we had last year will be fixed. They will be opening up more areas for camping.

There were only a few concerns of the facilities manager that we will need to address:

- *First: Clean up your dog poop! Most people we good about taking Fido out where no one was camping, but then figured that they didn't need to clean it up. Please do. If we leave the same mess as last year, we will be charged an additional clean up fee.*
- *Second: NO!!!!!! Alterations to the stalls. No screw eyes and especially no damage to the screens. We will be charged for any damage and the cost will be passed on to the stall renter.*
- *Third: We really have to work at keeping the fire lanes clear. Also, the handicapped seating must be open. They have gotten in trouble in the past. The **handicapped** person and one attendant is all that will be allowed. Sorry no additional family members. Guess its Federal regulations.*

Amber has done an exceptional job on the awards again. I am sure everyone will be pleased.

We also spent some time discussing alternate financing methods. It takes approximately \$30,000 per year to put on Interstate. Thanks to our Queens and Princesses, we have had the funds. But, with the economy the way it is, it has become harder and harder to get ads. We put way to much pressure on our

candidates to pay the way. Please put your heads together to come up with some ideas. We would like to get some more corporate sponsors. Call any of the committee with your suggestions.

Last, but certainly not least. The PSHA DVD for 2009. I have been working on getting pictures submitted again. If you didn't like who was included last year, or felt left out. SEND ME SOME PICTURES!!!!!!!!!!!!!! Otherwise I will try to find the most embarrassing pictures I can. Ask around, I am pretty good at getting Kodak moments!
