You need to have a 3 time average and be one of the top 12 riders in your age group per event to receive an invitation to State from our timekeeper. Invitations will be mailed in early August with all the particulars or you can refer to the website. **Classic Shows** will also be held in **August 22nd-23rd**. To ride at the Classic show you must have a 3 time average in each event, one time coming from a different arena. You must also have a classification card from your Region Timekeeper showing your classifications in those events that you are qualified in. **Interstate Meet** will be at Clark County Fairgrounds in Vancouver on **Labor Day Weekend**. We combine all age groups to Junior and Senior and you need to be in the top 10 riders to qualify for Interstate. These invitations are mailed with the State Finals Invitations.
