Could region representatives discuss with their members about considering only going to 3rd or 4th place and then that money could be distributed to the other placing and raise the quality of the prizes. In order to change this it would have to be a proposal for the annual meeting and if passed could go for 2010. We are only asking for opinions. Can't change that this year. Also remember any other suggestions, please e-mail Brian Strong or myself. We have tried changing the age divisions quite a few times, but that never passed. So we have a lot of people invited and they all want to win. Go Figure....

What do you think about dropping the last 2 or 3 places. That would be at least \$25 dropping 5th/6th and another \$20 if you dropped 4th place. Total of \$45 if you only placed to 3rd. We've never attempted this as far as I remember.

**The passing of one of the great ones.** Many of you remember *Id Rather Be Satin*. For those of you that don't remember this mare that could snake through poles and around barrels with amazing speed, pick up a State Finals or Interstate program and you will see many of her accomplishments. At 4 years of age, Satin and Dacia Miller-Spakes, qualified for State Finals and began their long career of winning State and Interstate Championships. Satin was not only a two-time Supreme Champion but she accomplished something nobody else has ever achieved; she won every individual Jr. event at the 1988 State Finals. Dacia and Satin still hold the Jr. Keyhole and Figure 8 record. With Dacia riding Satin and Dacia's dad, Jerry Miller, riding Satin's sire, Millers Gray Baron, they held the Two Man Stake record for 11 years. Dacia on Satin and Corrina Jarvis on Docs Chessie Cat held the Interstate Two Man Stake record. Satin won countless State and

Interstate Championships not only with Dacia, but also for the rest of the Miller family (Jerry, Amy and Marsha). As a 5 year old, Satin either won or was in the top 3 placings in the barrel futurities. Satin was a WBRA Champion and many times she was in the top 5. Satin won over \$100,000 running barrels on the Pro-Rodeo circuit. This great mare was recently laid to rest at the age of 27. Jerry and Toni have Satin's son, Id Rather Be Dashin, who is the sire of several up and coming games horses. May Satin's memory live on.
